- James words are about any who have more than another



- Things should never be put above people
- "Your wealth has rotted, and moths have eaten your clothes. Your gold and silver are corroded."
 James 5:2-3

- James 5:7-12
- "Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains.



You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near. Don't grumble against one another, brothers and sisters, or you will be judged. The Judge is standing at the door!" James 5:7-9



- "be patient" literally means to be long-tempered
- "Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer"
 Romans 12:12
